The GRETA project is an innovative educational project funded by Erasmus+ Programme. Yes, the project's name was chosen in tribute to Greta Thunberg, the Swedish teenager who inspired an international movement to fight climate change. The project runs for 24 months and is focused on climate change issues. The project team has already completed developing and implementing innovative educational resources for teachers and primary school pupils.



### EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL PUPILS

The project team has developed 42 WebQuests on six climate change topics and implemented them with pupils aged 8-12 in 7 European countries. WebQuests are innovative educational tools that support independent thinking and problem-solving skills.

### EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES FOR TEACHERS AND PARENTS

We have implemented the training programmes for primary school teachers and parents. The teachers learned how to prepare their own challenge-based learning resources. The parents improved their climate literacy skills.

The project's final conference took place in Greece, in Rafina, on the 23rd of June 2022.
